

Making “Cents” of Money

Fun coin games for financial learning

Learning about money doesn't have to be boring—it can be a game! Coin games are a great way to practice identifying coins, counting change, and developing smart money strategies. These playful challenges can help you gain confidence in handling money while building a strong foundation for future financial decisions.

Flip a Coin: A Probability Game

Materials: A coin, paper, and pencil

1. Predict whether the coin will land on heads or tails.
2. Flip the coin and record the results.
3. Keep playing and discuss how often it lands on heads or tails. That's called probability!

Coin Tic-Tac-Toe

Materials: Coins, a tic-tac-toe board, and a family member or friend

1. Choose to play as either heads or tails.
2. Take turns placing your coin on the tic-tac-toe board to get three in a row.

Race to a Dollar

Materials: Variety of coins, paper, and a die

1. Lay the paper out in front of you as your wallet. Pile all the coins in the center.
2. On your turn, roll the die and collect that number of coins. For example, if you roll a 4, take four coins.
3. If you want to practice swapping denominations, trade smaller coins for larger ones.
4. The first player to reach exactly \$1 wins!
