## Parts of a (oin

If you read the last edition of our *Kids Club* newsletter, you learned how to decode the United States dollar bill. In this issue, we are focusing on U.S. coins!

- **1. Obverse** In a coin toss, this side of the coin is more commonly referred to as "heads." This is the front side of the coin.
- 2. Reverse In a coin toss, this side of the coin is more commonly referred to as "tails." This is the back side of the coin.
- **3. Bust** On the obverse side of a coin is a bust, an image from the neck up, of a U.S. president or an American historical figure.
- 4. Mint mark The small letter on the obverse side of the coin shows which mint location made the coin. The two most common mint marks are "P" for Philadelphia and "D" for Denver.
- 5. Date The reverse of every coin will feature the year it was minted.
- 6. Artist/designer On the reverse side of some coins, you will see two or three small letters, which are the initials of the artist who designed and sculpted the reverse of the coin.
- 7. Inscription The reverse of every coin will feature the words *E Pluribus Unum*, which means "Out of many, one."
